UPDATED: Fourth Street Bridge Incident, Revelstoke, BC

Revelstoke, B.C – The City of Revelstoke was alerted to a vehicle incident on the Fourth Street Bridge on Thursday, August 1, at approximately 11:50 a.m. The passengers of the vehicle were immediately transported to the hospital for assessment.

By 12 p.m., the RCMP, Revelstoke Fire Department and multiple City crews were on the scene closing the bridge to traffic and assessing the situation. The municipal vehicle incident resulted in damage to the Fourth Street Bridge and the corresponding vac truck. No members of the public nor their vehicles were damaged by this event.

The City of Revelstoke's Public Works crews cleared the scene and removed the obstacle. Other City staff coordinated with BC Ambulance, RCMP, Revelstoke Fire Department and the Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure to ensure the situation was managed appropriately, safely and quickly. The bridge was reopened to pedestrians and lightweight vehicles at approximately 13:40 p.m. on August 1, 2024.

As of Friday, August 2, the weight restriction has been rescinded. However, a new speed limit of 15 kph is now in place to ensure the structural safety of the bridge while the team works to procure the necessary replacement parts.

The City can confirm there were no serious or life-threatening injuries resulting from this incident. The City thanks all teams and stakeholders involved in ensuring this situation was managed safely.
