The City of Revelstoke is Pumped to Open New Pump Track on July 3!

Revelstoke, B.C – The City of Revelstoke is set to open its new pump track on July 3, thanks to the support of Revelstoke Community Forest Corporation and the Resort Municipality Funding Program.

Residents will soon have a new place to get active and enjoy outdoor sports with the upcoming opening of the Pump Track at Centennial Park. The new pump track will offer riders of all skill levels a dynamic and inclusive space to ride, learn, and progress. **The new facility features three distinct tracks designed to cater to a wide range of abilities:**

- Beginner Track – A smooth, flowing loop perfect for young riders and those new to pump tracks.
- Intermediate Track – A more challenging course with varied rollers and berms to help riders build confidence and technique.
- Advanced Jump Line – Designed for experienced riders, this track includes jump lines for high-adrenaline fun.

“The pump track is a great addition to Centennial Park, offering a fun and engaging space where kids, teens, and adults alike can enjoy the outdoors, stay active, and connect with others. The project not only enhances recreational opportunities in Revelstoke but also promotes healthy lifestyles and skill development.” Laurie Donato, Director of Parks, Recreation and Culture.

The facility will be open to the public on Thursday, July 3rd with an official ribbon-cutting ceremony at 12:00 pm noon. Until the grand opening, the site remains an active construction zone, and entering is considered trespassing.
