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### BYLAWS

- *Development Services— Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 2254—Minimum Residential Unit Size* — Council gave First and Second reading and moved to waive the public hearing requirement for this amendment as the text is consistent with the Official Community Plan. This amendment facilitates a diversity of housing opportunities which responds to Council’s Priority of Livability in Revelstoke, it addresses housing needs and affordable housing challenges. - *Development Services—Delegation Amendment Bylaw No. 2255*—Council gave First, Second and Third reading. This amendment contributes to Organizational Resilience by streamlining work and approval processes to facilitate efficient processes, optimize use of Council time and City resources as well as provide improved customer service. - *Finance—Fees & Charges Bylaw No. 2256*—Council gave First, Second and Third reading. The Fees & Charges schedules consist of fees payable to the City, the amendment will improve the City’s ability to fund the services it provides.
