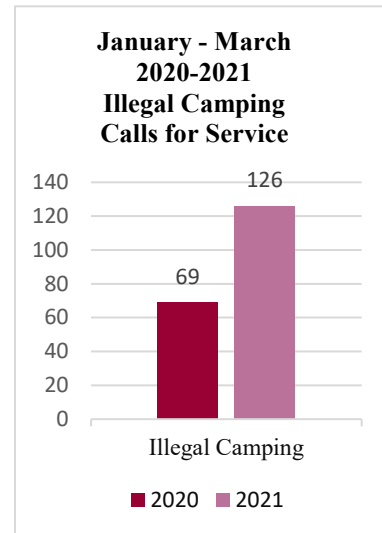
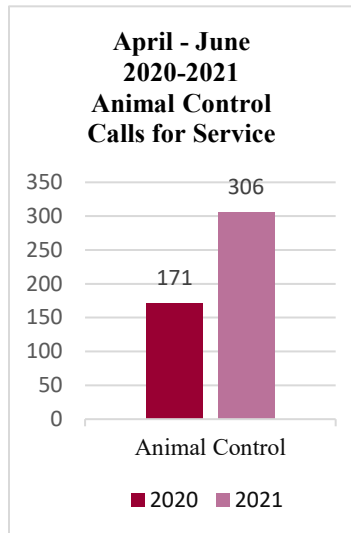
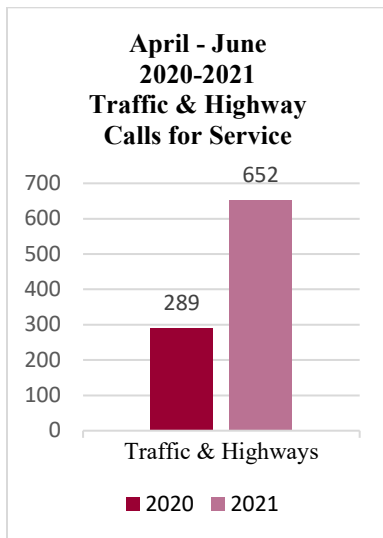

April - June 2021 Quarterly Report



Animal Control

- 15 dog attack/aggressive dog calls.
- 5 impounded dogs – all re-united with their owners.
- 24 new and renewed dog licenses purchased this quarter, 18 were lifetime licenses.
- Calls for service increased by **79%** over the same period last year. Bylaw officers have noticed a marked increase in the number of dogs in Revelstoke.

Traffic & Highways:

- Calls for service increased by **125%** over the same period last year. This may be due to increased mobility because of Covid 19 vaccination programs.

Illegal Camping

- There continues to be an increase in Illegal Camping infractions within City limits, with an **83%** increase in calls for service over the same quarter in 2020.

Additional Notes:

- There was a **173%** increase overall in calls for service compared to the same period last year.
- A large number of calls for service this quarter resulted in “Gone On Arrival”. Overall, GOA outcomes increased by **274%** over the same quarter in 2020. This coincides with the overall increase in Calls for Service, particularly Traffic & Highways.
- **303** warning tickets were issued this quarter, focusing on public education regarding parking and watering regulations. **29** MTI tickets were issued this quarter.
- \$6000 in fines were issued this quarter, plus \$600 Public Nuisance fines issued by the RCMP.
